The chairman explained the changes made for NewsML 3.2:

* All 3.2 adjustments are FULLY backwards-compatible. (They are additions, not subtractions.)

* Change content component of body.head from hedline? to hedline*

* Add idsrc and value attributes to lang element

* Changed dd's content model from (block)* to (block | %block.content;)*



* Added common-attributes ("class" and "style") to: pronounce classifier distributor pre org person name.given name.family postaddr

* Ruby integration: "When <pronounce> is just not good enough!"

Strategy: Follow W3C guidelines for including the "off-the-shelf" Ruby DTD module at <http://www.w3.org/TR/ruby-implementation/#dtd-integrate-howto>
